Portable Newborn Warmer

(Prevention and Management of Hypothermia)



Embrace warmer is an inexpensive and durable solution to stabilize neonate body temprature. It is reusable, portable, hygienic and simple to use.

Service providers trained on use of Embrace unit and KMC

Mothers sensitised on KMC

26 Health facilites and ambulances provided with portable newborn warmer units

In shock, the brain, heart and lungs are deprived of oxygen because blood accumulates in the lower abdomen and legs.

NASG reverses shock by returning blood to the vital organs - heart, brain and lungs.
