# Cases pending with JJBs according to nature of the offence



- A decrease in not heinous cases over the last 2 quarters
- An increase in heinous cases in all four quarters
- Total cases pending with the JJBs also show an increasing trend in the first 3 quarters.

# Cases disposed out of total pending cases with JJBs



- % of cases disposed in the first three quarters showed a declining trend
- Last quarter shows increase in the disposed cases out of the total pending cases with the JJBs.

#### Heinous cases pending > 6 months

- No change in pendency of heinous cases in the last three quarters (April to December 2014), i.e., heinous cases pending more than 6 months remained same.

#### Not Heinous Cases pending > 6 months

- An increase in pending cases in the second and third quarters (April-September 2014
- A decrease in the pending cases in the last quarter (October-December 2014)

#### Total cases pending > 6 months

- An increase in pending cases in the second and fourth quarter
- Slight decrease in pending cases in the third quarter followed by increase again in the last quarter.







- Siwan and Nalanda had higher % of >6month pending cases in last two quarters.
- About 40-50% districts reported more than 20% cases pending beyond 6 months in all the quarters

Sheikhpura and Lakhisarai reported zero cases pending beyond 6





# Cases disposed out of total pending cases with CWCs




- A decrease in the % of cases disposed by the CWCs in the second guarter from 57.1% to 49.0%




