
### PRIORITIZING HEALTH IN LEGISLATIVE SPACES, ODISHA (2018-19)

## Odisha's 15th Legislative Assembly Membership




**Women in OLA**










#### **Duration of assembly sittings**



in number of health related questions in recent sessions compared to base session (7th session).

In 13th session number of questions reduced by more than half compared to 12th session.

2nd highest in Infant mortality1

3<sup>rd</sup> highest in Under-five mortality<sup>1</sup>



**02** female MLAs asked **07** questions on health




Starred<sup>5</sup> Questions 17 (5.2%) Unstarred<sup>6</sup> questions 142 (6.7%)

While there was an increase in unstarred question on health compared to 12th session,


priority to health has **decreased** compared to base period (7th Session)
