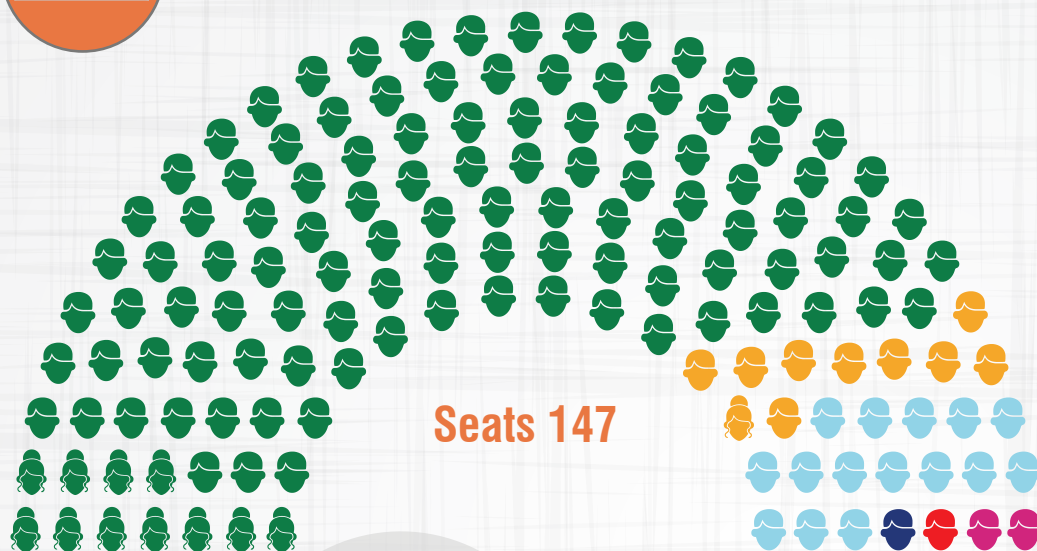


# PRIORITIZING HEALTH IN LEGISLATIVE SPACES, ODISHA (2018-19)

This factsheet presents an analysis of **15<sup>th</sup> Odisha Legislative Assembly (OLA)** and priority given to health in legislative sessions during 2016-18.

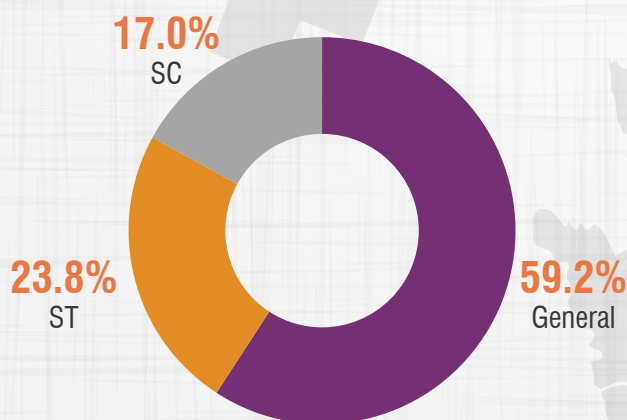

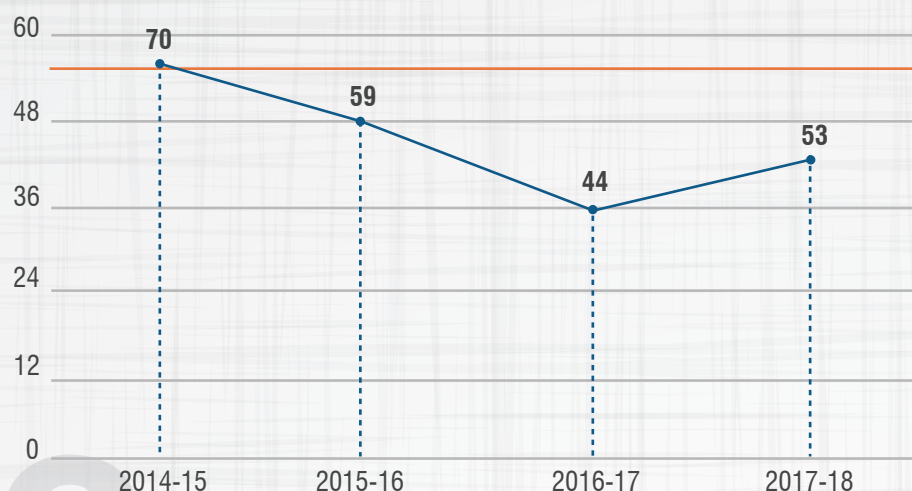

## Duration of assembly sittings

On an average, the 15th assembly sat for **57** days per year during 2014-2018.

For 2018-19, assembly was in session for 18 days.  
Budget session is due in February, 2019.

There has been a **significant increase** in number of health related questions in recent sessions compared to base session (7<sup>th</sup> session).

In 13<sup>th</sup> session number of questions reduced by more than half compared to 12<sup>th</sup> session.

**2<sup>nd</sup>** highest in Infant mortality<sup>1</sup>

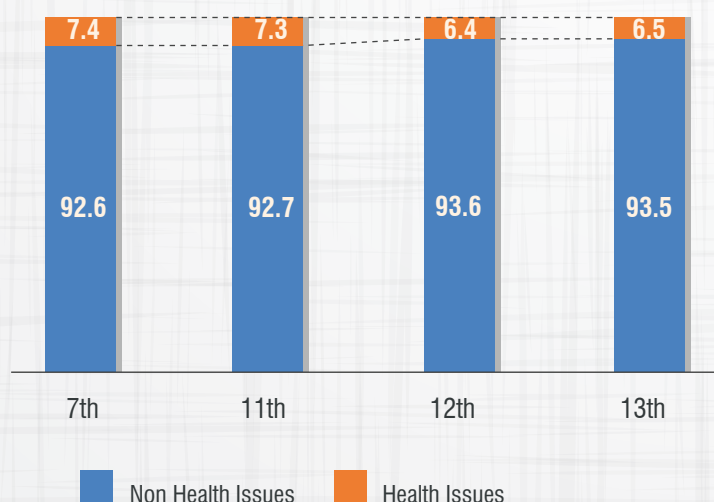
**3<sup>rd</sup>** highest in Under-five mortality<sup>1</sup>

**3<sup>rd</sup>** highest in Malaria deaths<sup>2</sup>

**5<sup>th</sup>** highest in Maternal mortality<sup>3</sup>

**11<sup>th</sup>** highest in annual TB notification rate<sup>4</sup>

**Yet**, health related question account for only **6.5%** of the total questions raised in the assembly.



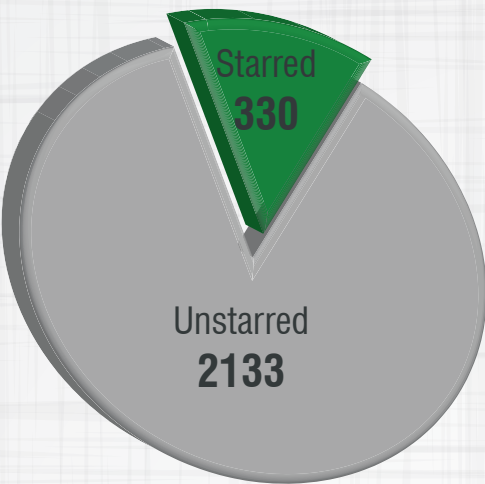

Questions by MLAs in 13<sup>th</sup> session




Out of **2463** Questions  
only **159** (6.5%) questions were asked on health

**152** questions on health




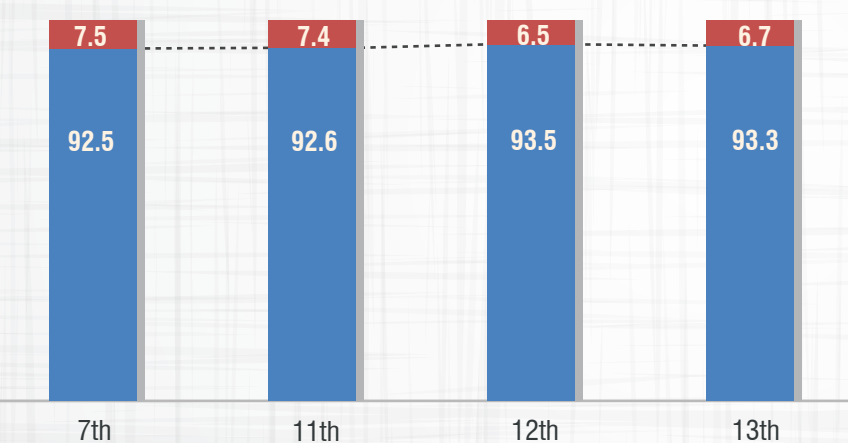

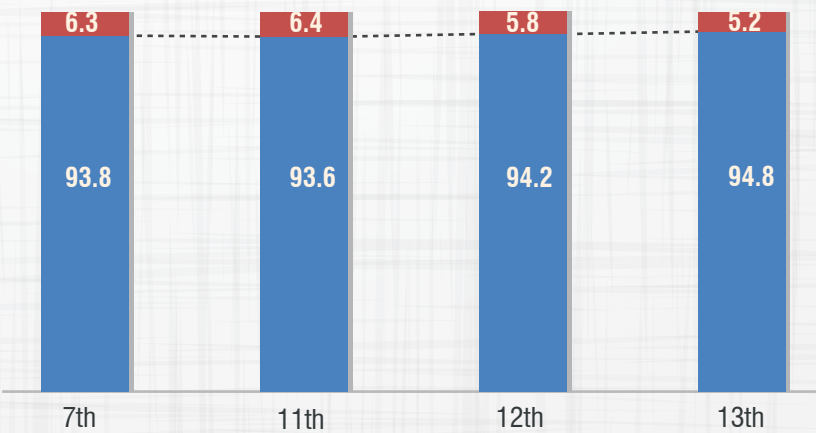


While there was an **increase** in unstarred question on health compared to 12<sup>th</sup> session, priority to health has **decreased** compared to base period (7<sup>th</sup> Session)

 % of starred questions asked related to non-health issues



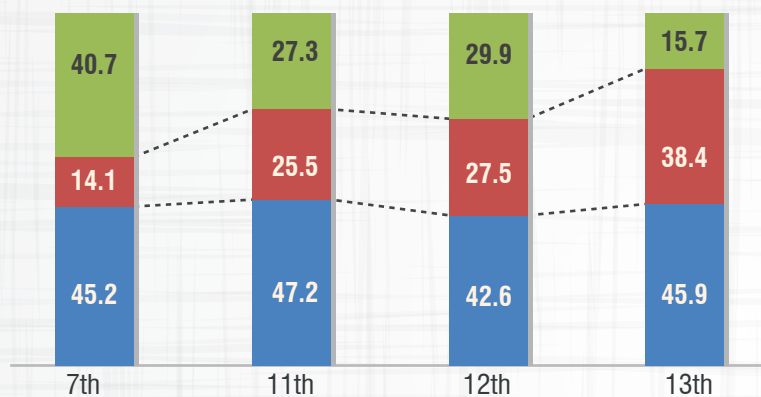
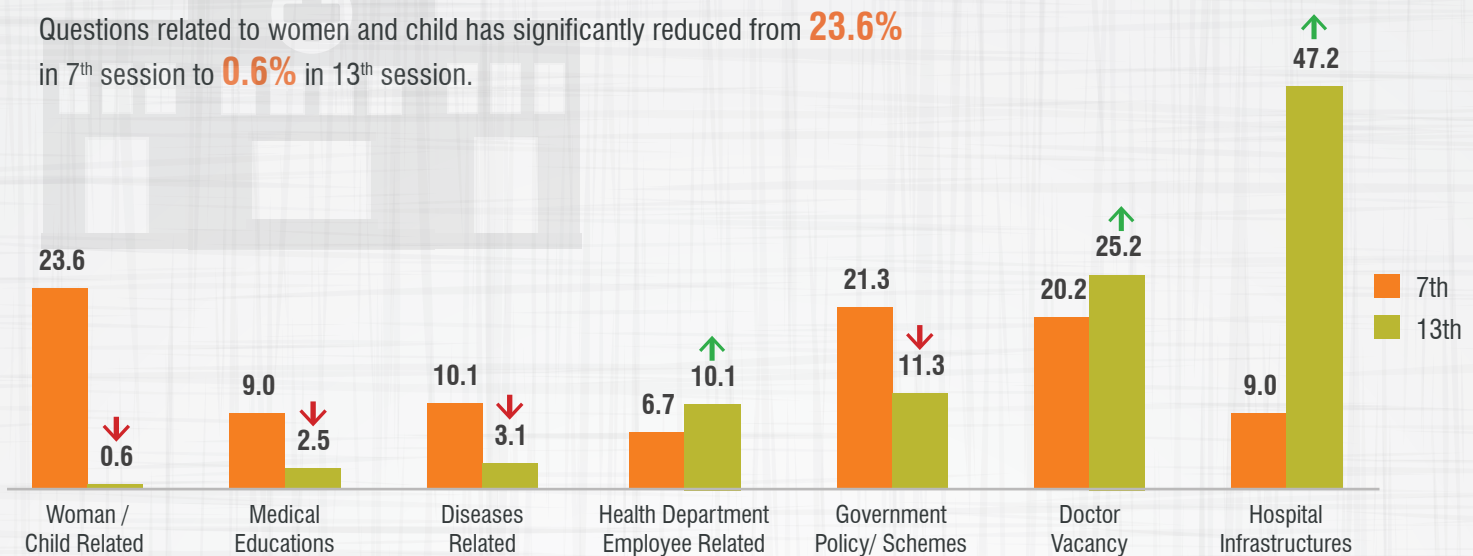
<sup>5</sup> Starred: Questions to which answers are desired to be given orally on the floor of the House during the Question Hour. These are distinguished in the printed lists by asterisks. 15 such questions are listed each day.

<sup>6</sup> Unstarred: Questions to which written answers are given by Ministers which are deemed to have been laid on the Table of the House at the end of the Question Hour. Upto 160 such questions are listed each day in a separate list.



Hospital infrastructure alone accounted for **48%** of health related questions.

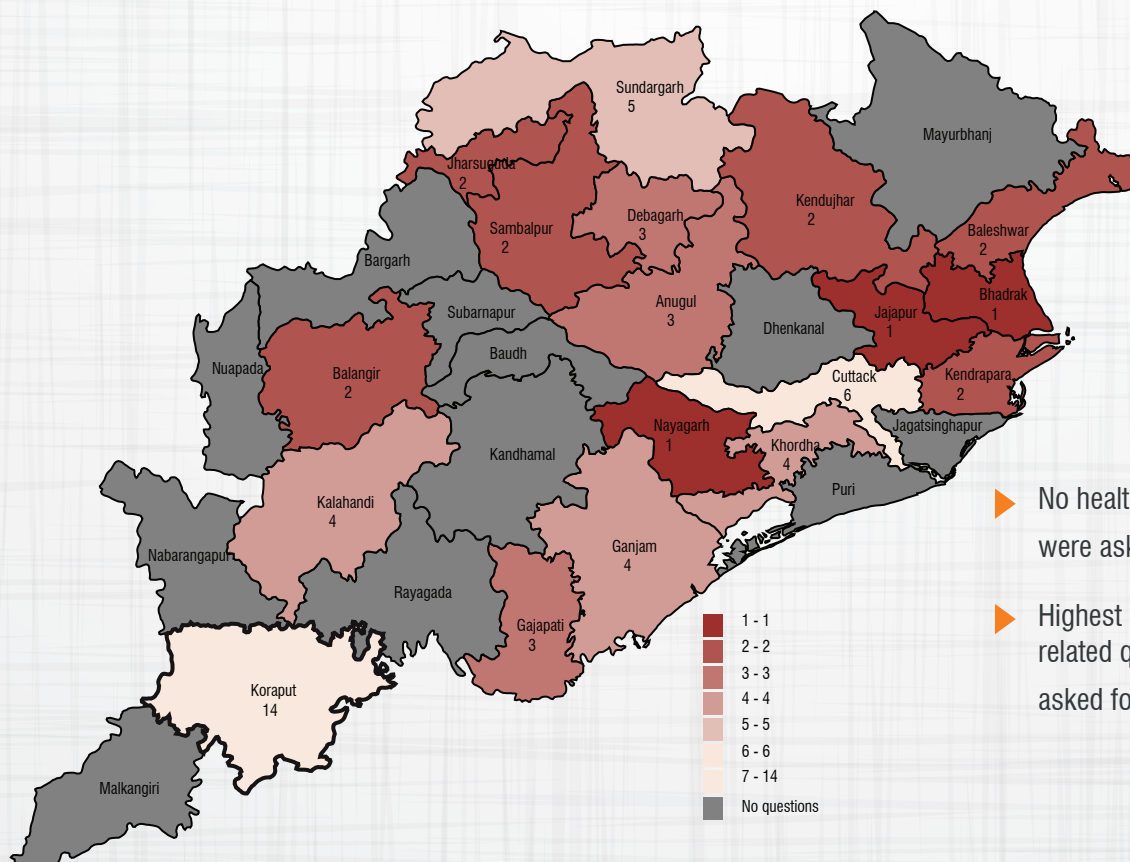
Questions related to women and child has significantly reduced from **23.6%** in 7<sup>th</sup> session to **0.6%** in 13<sup>th</sup> session.



- ▶ District level questions on health issues has **increased** significantly over base period (7<sup>th</sup> session).
- ▶ Constituency level questions have **decreased**.
