

#### Are children safe at home during lockdown?

Children, women and older people are being exposed for a longer time to their abusers at home during a pandemic period like this. As per WHO, **92000** child abuse reports to one helpline in India.


#### Why are children facing more risk?

- Lesser opportunities than adults to go out and seek help.
- Lack of access to school as a safe space and no school-related support networks due to school closures.
- Heightened risk of online abuse due to increased time online.




#### What do facts tell us?

### Rate of crime against children in Odisha has increased 2.2 times between 2017 & 2019




▶ Latest rate of crime against children in Odisha, 49.9 per one lakh population, is higher than national average of 33.2, which makes Odisha the 12th highest unsafe state in the country for children.

## Odisha ranked 3rd in kidnapping & abduction of children in india




▶ Rate of Kidnapping and abduction of children in the state is 2 times more than the national average.

## Kidnapping and POCSO cases in the state are rising at an alarming rate




Between 2017 and 2019, the rate of kidnapping & abduction of children in Odisha has increased almost 4 times.

## Odisha's share in total crime against children in India has been increasing in the past two years



► Around **5%** of total crimes taking place against children in India are from Odisha, that is **7th** highest among other states and UTs.

## Odisha reported higher rate of POCSO<sup>2</sup> cases than national average



- ► All 2124 victims of POCSO cases (2019) in Odisha were girls.
- ► Odisha reported **13th** highest rate of Rape cases against children in the country.
- State has a higher rate of Rape cases against children (1.6 per one lakh population) than national average of 1.1.
